#### Main fields of research:

- In the centre of his interest there is the late medieval Hungarian Church History. For example he conducted archontological and prosopographical research about the cathedral chapter of Pécs, wrote biographies of the bishops of Pécs (1361–1526), worked up the operation of the bishopric curia, the management of assets of the bishopric and the chapter.
